"There are 2 reasons why I wanted to get together with you (or stop by)."

First, I want to tell you more about Cru.

Second, I wanted to get a chance to meet you and see if we can help in any way."

First, let me tell you a little about Cru. It is an interdenominational Christian organization that was founded in 1951 at UCLA. We are on almost every major campus in the US and in most countries around the world. Basically, we have a two-fold purpose:

1. To help students understand what it means to become a Christian and break down misconceptions. We have found that a lot of students have misconceptions about what it means to know God personally.
2. To provide resources to help people grow in their relationship with God.

We do that in 3 ways basically:

1. *We have a weekly meeting - explain what happens there/time/place*
2. *We have small group Bible studies (explain purpose)*
3. *We have conferences (talk about the next conference and invite them).*

Any questions about all that?

Hey, there's something else we like to find out. There are 2 questions that I like to ask that I think are pretty important questions in life. Can I get your opinion?

1. If you were to die tonight, on a scale of 0-100%, how sure are you that you would go to heaven?

2. Suppose you were to die tonight and /God asked you why He should let you into heaven, what would you tell Him?

Then transition into the gospel. Something like, "I have something that explains how you can be 100% sure that you'll spend eternity in heaven. I was wondering if I could take a few minutes to show it to you. It only takes about 15 minutes. Would that be OK?"
